3. No Trash! (This is NOT a dump. Please keep all glass, metals and plastics out of the compost pile)
4. The brush pile is available for Marine residents only! (The compost attendant will have a list of all Marine residents. If you are not on the list, please contact the City office.)
5. As always, the compost site will close during weather when there is thunder and lightning.

NEW FIRE PERMIT FEE January 1, 2012 The cost per permit is \$5.00 for piles or \$15.00 for a prescribed burn permit. Each permit is good for up to 3 consecutive days. You can contact the City office during regular business hours Monday thru Thursday to obtain a permit.

Permits Required with less than 3 inches of snow.

“There goes that darn siren again!”

And I'll bet you rolled over, put the pillow over your ears, and tried to go back to sleep. But did you know there are about 30 people in Town, your friends and neighbors who did not roll over and go back to sleep but dragged their sorry selves out of bed, jumped into some clothes, and hurried to see who needed help. Those friends of yours, perhaps parents of your children's school mates, maybe the person in the next pew on Sunday morning, or your neighbor down the street, are what make up the Marine Fire and Rescue units, and they do that **about 100 times a year.**

Thanksgiving Day 2012 while most of you were sitting down to your pie, that siren sounded and the call was answered. On **almost any Sunday afternoon** when the sun is warm and bright and you're playing ball with your son or riding the bike with your daughter, that siren sounded and the call was answered.

Those 30 or so tireless people are proud of what they do, and they are glad to serve, but they need your help. That **4%** of the Village population that makes that commitment, **needs your help.**

The time is come, now, not when the kids are grown, not when work is stable, not when you think you might have more time, **but the time has come now** for you to step forward and join their ranks, be counted as one of the few.

SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK 2013

Minnesota Severe Weather Awareness Week is April 15-19, 2013.

For more than 25 years, the state of Minnesota has conducted a Severe Weather Awareness Week in partnership with the National Weather Service and local governments.

The information campaign is designed to teach and remind Minnesotans about weather hazards and provides resources to minimize the risks associated with severe weather.

Using this site as a guide, everyone is encouraged to make a plan, [build](#) an emergency kit and practice their emergency plans.

The main event of Severe Weather Awareness Week is the annual statewide tornado drills. [These drills are scheduled for Thursday, April 18 at 1:45 p.m. and 6:55 p.m.](#) At those times, sirens and NOAA Weather Radios are will sound in a simulated tornado warning. The first drill is intended for institutions and businesses, while the evening drill is intended for second shift workers and especially families.

Why Severe Weather Awareness Week?

According to the National Weather Service, Minnesota experiences an average of 40 tornadoes per year. In 2012, 37 twisters touched down. A record was set in 2010 with 104 tornadoes across the state.

Historic Mill Site- Curt Moe

The Minnesota Historical Society (MHS) has developed a renewed interest in further improvements at the Mill Site, as a result of a series of meetings Council Member Dan Willenbring has coordinated with MHS, with members of the City Council's Village Center Task Force (VCTF) and with the Mill Site Committee.

The meetings so far have focused on making MHS management aware of the progress the town's volunteers have made at the Mill Site, the VCTF plans for the town, their ideas for improvements at the Mill Site and looking for ways that the groups can combine efforts for improvements at the Mill Site. These meetings have raised the Mill Site's visibility at MHS and moved us up on their priority list.

We are cautiously optimistic that one result of these efforts will be improving the river trail behind the General Store sometime this fall. The City's engineer is developing a proposal for these improvements, which will need approval and funding by MHS.

This trail has erosion issues due to water runoff from Hwy 95, Cty Rd 4 and Marine's streets. A more extensive solution to this issue is being developed by the city in meetings with MnDOT, Washington County and other parties. It's a complicated issue and will take time to develop a comprehensive solution.

MHS is also open to expanding the Mill Site's trail network along the river to the lower ruins. This would, however, require an expensive archaeological study of these areas. We hope to see a decision on this in the next 2 to 3 years. The City Council has sent a letter to our local State Senator Housley and State Representative Dettmer encouraging their support for funding a detailed cultural resource study for the Mill Site.

Accomplishments of 2012:

Helping the 100+ newly planted trees flourish!!! (Thanks to the watering efforts of our volunteers, we've lost only 2, an incredible survival rate)

- * Repaired the overlook deck and repaired and extended the fence* Resurfaced the trails * Treated critical trees for Dutch Elm disease
- * Developed and used funding from MHS & Washington County Conservation District * Continued removal of invasives

Plans for the coming year include:

- * Maintaining the 100+ trees planted in the last 2 years * Development of prairie grasses by the upper ruins
- * Continued removal of invasives throughout the site * Burning of brush piles.
- * Continued meetings with VCTF, MHS and other organizations to develop and implement improvements at the Mill Site.

Thanks to all of those who have helped us at the Mill Site, including the volunteers from Christ Lutheran Church; the City of Marine on St. Croix including Jason Crotty, Tommy Boessel, Lynette Petersen & Mary Tomnitz; and most importantly, our very dedicated volunteer core group of Anne Reich, Jack Warren, Jim Schoeller & David Stephens. As always, we could always use a hand at the Mill Site – look for posting on the Marine Facebook page or posters in town.

Village Center Task Force – Dan Willenbring

The VCTF has been working on establishing our 2013 work efforts. These efforts include:

- * Continued Collaboration with stakeholders and key agency partners * River access from Maple Street
- * Village Center Stormwater study *Burris Park trail link
- * Improvements at the lower Mill Site * Third St. concepts including a strategy on placement of dumpsters
- * Creating standard documentation for grant submittal applications

Significant effort has been put forth in identifying the components to mitigate the storm water that runs directly into the St. Croix River. We are coordinating with MN/DOT, Washington County and the Marine Carnelian Watershed District to define the scope and boundary of a hydraulic study. Once this is defined, our City Engineer will be presenting a proposal to undertake that portion of study that is the City's responsibility. This is a very important first step which will determine the magnitude of the stormwater that needs to be controlled. This proposal will require City Council approval before any work proceeds.

The VCTF is also working closely with the Minnesota Historical Society and MHS volunteers. See Curt Moe's update on the Mill Site.

Special thanks to Tod Drescher, Jack Warren, Mary Vogel, Andy Kramer, Nancy Cosgriff, Karen Kramer, Kristina Smitten and Karl Benson for their volunteer efforts on this task force and to Curt Moe for coordinating our efforts with the Minnesota Historical Society.

Attention Dog Owners



Just a few reminders. Its that time of year again to please have your dog license renewed. You can find the application in this issue. Please review the following information as some changes have been made to the impound fees. **Also, it has been brought to the City's attention that a number of dogs that have been unleashed and running loose around town.** A full copy of the City Code is available on our website at marine.govoffice.com.

Marine on St. Croix City Code Chapter 5

Subdivision 4 Running at Large Prohibited. No dog shall be permitted to run at large within the limits of the City.

Subdivision 5. Any dog found running at large in violation of any provision of this ordinance may be captured and impounded by a peace officer of the City or by a party designated by resolution of City Council. Such peace officer or designee is authorized to go on private property other than into dwelling house to effect such capture. If not claimed within five (5) calendar days after capture and impounding, the peace officer or designee is authorized to destroy the impounded dog in a humane manner. An impounded dog may be claimed by the owner within five days after the capture and impounding by pay the boarding fee, license fee due under this ordinance, including a penalty for late issuance of license, and handling fee to the City of ten dollars (\$10.00). The impoundment fee shall be **\$90.00** for the first and second impoundment and **\$150.00** for the third or any additional impoundments. The foregoing fees are in addition to and not in lieu of the general liability of the dog owner under Subd. 16 of the ordinance as amended. No animal shall be retrieved from impound without proof of current rabies vaccination.

Subdivision 6. DOGS ON LEASH; SANITATION. Persons shall be permitted to take dogs onto public streets, sidewalks, trails and parks (other than areas clearly marked by signs bearing the words ("dogs not permitted in the area")) provided such dogs are under the control of the owner or custodian and restricted at all times by a suitable leash, Any person having the custody or control of a dog off the premises of the owner shall have the duty to immediately remove any feces left by such animal and to dispose of such feces in a sanitary manner. **It shall furthermore be the duty of each such person have control of any dog off the premises of the owner to have in such person's possession a device or means for the picking up an removal of animal feces.**

CHICKEN ORDINANCE - City Code, Chapter 5: 5.02 Chickens on Parcels Less than 5 Acres

The City Council has adopted an Ordinance relating to Chickens on Parcels Less than 5 acres.

Subdivision 1. DEFINITIONS

(1) "OWNER" means any person, firm or corporation owning, or harboring, or keeping chickens.

Subd. 2. PERMIT REQUIRED.

- (1) No person shall, on any lot less than 5 acres anywhere in the city keep, harbor, or maintain care, custody, or control over any chicken, without obtaining a permit issued by the City of Marine.
- (2) The permit shall be subject to all terms and conditions of this Section and any additional conditions deemed necessary by the City to protect the public health, safety, and welfare. The necessary permit may be obtained from the City Clerk.

Subd. 3. APPLICATION.

Included with the information required prior to issuance of the permit must be a scaled diagram that indicates the lot size, the number of chickens, the location of any chicken coop and run, which includes the distance from dwelling units on the parcel and abutting properties and the approximate size of the chicken coop and run. All setbacks for accessory buildings in that zoning area will be complied with for placement of coop. If the coop exceeds 120 square feet a building permit will be required.

Subd. 4. NUMBER ALLOWED.

For parcels that are less than one-half (1/2) acre the maximum number of chickens is five (5). For every additional one (1) acre of land an additional five (5) chickens may be kept.

Subd. 5. CONFINEMENT STANDARDS. Every person who owns, controls, keeps, maintains or harbors chickens by permit must keep them confined on the premises at all times. If confinement is in a chicken coop or chicken run the following standards apply:

1. The coop shall be kept at least 10 feet from any residential structure or wells.
2. All chicken coops and runs must be located within the rear yard.
3. Chicken feed must be kept in metal, predator proof containers.
4. The run shall be kept at least 10 feet from property line unless adjoining property owner agrees to lesser setback.

Subd. 6. CONDITIONS AND INSPECTION. No person who owns, controls, keeps, maintains or harbors chickens shall permit the premises where the chickens are kept to be or remain in an unhealthy, unsanitary or noxious condition or to permit the premises to be in such condition that noxious odors are carried to adjacent public or private property.

Subd. 7. PROHIBITED USES. The following uses are not allowed as they pertain to this Section:

1. Roosters
2. Breeding, raising or slaughtering of chickens for a commercial purpose
3. Odors, solid matter or noise of such quality or quantity as to be reasonably objectionable at any point beyond the lot line of the site on which the use is located.

Subd. 8. PUBLIC NUISANCE. Failure to comply with this ordinance constitutes a public nuisance and is subject to the revocation of the permit, issuance of fines and assessment of costs related to ensure compliance with this section.

The necessary permit may be obtained from the City Offices during normal business hours.

Residents that currently have chickens are required to come into compliance by May 1, 2013

General User Guideline:

- ◆ **No Horses!** All Marine City Trails are Posted "**No Horses**" Due to trail damage and erosion concerns.
- ◆ Keep right so others can pass.
- ◆ Obey traffic signs and rules.
- ◆ Respect adjoining landowners rights and privacy.
- ◆ Share the trail with others.
- ◆ Enjoy the beauty of nature and do not disturb the plants and animals.
- ◆ **No motorized traffic** (except for motorized wheelchairs).
- ◆ **Keep all pets on a leash** and remove all waste
- ◆ Pick up all garbage and litter.
- ◆ Warn other trail users when passing.
- ◆ **Stay on designated trails; do not take shortcuts.**



Historic Walking Tour Maps

The Marine Restoration Society in conjunction with the Parks and Trails Committee of the City of Marine have partnered to produce an Historical Walking Tour Map of Marine on St. Croix. The map is available at local businesses and at the City offices for \$5. Proceeds from the sale of the map support the work of the Restoration Society, which promotes the cultural and historical awareness of the village.
